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INTEGRITY AND ETHICAL DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

FOR STUDENTS:

- College Life Skills Workshop Series offered in Spring, Summer, and Fall focused around topics of Academic Integrity, Ethics, and Professionalism.
- Available to present/facilitate a workshop at a student organization meeting, fraternity or sorority chapter meeting, and/ or a leadership team meeting.
- Educational sanctioning office for students found in-violation of academic misconduct.
- Coaching sessions on navigating the traps of academic misconduct and how to handle situations where ethical decisions need to be made.
